Past Events

The water was a little on the cool side but it didn't stop most from taking a dip. The food was plentiful and good. The cooking was handled mostly by Angelo Correnti and John Haskell. The Boat-B-Que which was scheduled for Saturday, August 9th was rescheduled for

On Sunday, August 17th, there was a non-point/transect dive out to an area between 3 1/2 Fathom Ledge and Graves Light. There were two boats and seven divers on site. As reported previously, they were diving at 100 feet on a gravel bottom. They set six lines. Following the transect dive a second dive was done at the Graves where a strong current was encountered. Angelo Correnti reported that Tommy Lo's boat developed a leak and Tommy had to pull the boat at the end of the day.

The August point dive was on Sunday, Aug. 24th. There were four boats to transport eleven divers. The skippers were: Ed Bates, Angelo Correnti, Tommy Lo and Gary Osborne. The rest of the divers were: Jeanine Fabian, Phillip (non member), Tim Nui, Kathy Bell, William Woodman, Doug Meyer and Joe Geyer. The first dive was at the Outer Brewster. There was limited visibility and 58 degree water. The second dive was at the Graves where there was better visibility and the water temperature was about the same.

On Tuesday, August 26th, there was a night point dive. Skippers John Molis and John Haskell were at Landfall Marine where they waited until 6:30 p.m. before setting out on the dive. No other divers showed up. They went out to the Outer Brewster where they did one dive. Visibility was about ten feet with the assist of a underwater light. The bottom was crawling with lobster, look but not take. The maximum depth was 53 feet. The seas were flat calm.

NewMembers. There were two persons proposed for membership this past month. These parties are: John Washington, proposed by John Haskell and Howard Nickerson, proposed by Ed Bates. The applications were reviewed by the Board and voted on favorably by the Board.

Rescheduled Boat-B- Que. The new date for the boat-b-que is Saturday, September 6th. Boats will be departing the Quincy Yacht Club at 1:00 p.m.

Point dive and Spear Fishing Competition. On Sunday, September 14th, there

will be the point dive and a spear fishing competition held at King's Beach in Newport, R.I. If you are interested in the spear fishing competition and you don't have the gear, contact Jay Theriault or Charlie Matthews. They will help you out. Jay can be reached at (617) 696-0270 and Charlie's number is (781) 963-7577. Directions to the site from the clubhouse: Take Furness Brook Parkway to the X-way. Get on the X-way heading South. Go to the split and take Rte. 128 North, Follow Rte. 128 to Rte. 24. Enter onto Rte. 24 and drive on Rte. 24 into Rhode Island to Rte 114 South. Follow Rte. 114 into Newport and then get on Ocean Av. Drive on Ocean Av. for several miles around the point. Look for a sign for the King's Beach fishing ramp. You are there.

The following SSN Tournament Rules are in effect.

Only fish on the eligible fish list will count.

Human muscle loaded spearguns. (noCO2). No power heads of any kind. Starting time is 10:00 a.m. at the waters edge touching land.

Finish time 1:00 p.m. on the beach.

No trading or swapping of fish.

Human muscle only to your fishing spot.

No landing of any fish under R.I. leg.size

No landing of any fish in excess of R.I. bag limit.

You can not bring more than SSN bag limit to the weigh table. (If you have over the SSN bag limit, no test weighing, you choose which to enter and live with it.

On Sunday, September 21st, there will a nonpoint/transect dive. The boats will leave from the Quincy Yacht Club. Be at the club by 7:30 a.m. The boats will be underway at 8:00 a.m.

On Tuesday evening, September 23rd,

John Molis will be departing from Landfall Marine on a night point dive. As noted earlier, the ocean comes alive with the coming of darkness. There is a lot to see on these night dives.

Saturday, September 27th, Jay Theriault has scheduled a visit to the Peabody Essex Museum in Salem. Jay's game plan is to meet at the Denny's Rest. which is at exit 25 off of rte 128 North. He says it is at the Liberty Tree Mall. 


