PAST EVENTS

FOLLOWING THE MARINE FISHERIES HEARINGS HELD IN EARLY MAY, THE STATE HAS PLACED A FIFTEEN (15) LOBSTER A DAY CATCH LIIMT ON THE NON-COMMERCIAL LOBSTER LICENSE. THIS CHANGE GOES INTO EFFECT ON JULY 2, 2004.

Roy Chamberlain reported on the June point dive held on June 26th. The original site for the dive was 3 1/2 Fathom Ledge. But due to adverse weather the site had to be changed. The four divers who showed up for the dive were Jeanine Fabian, Marshal Reynard, Bob Striker and Roy. They decided at the pier that they would dive inside the outer islands and ended up scalloping. The boat was away from the dock promptly at 8:00 a.m.

Joe Geyer has reported that there are several potholes in the parking lot and wants everyone to be aware. Currently ther city is doing sewer repairs and there is stock and equipment occupying space in the lot. When their work is done a decision will be made on repairs to the lot.

Dina Solimini stated that there were six people out of ten sign-ups for the dinner night out at the Hill Top in Braintree on Friday, June11th. Dina and her fiance were joined by Tim Niu and Kathi Bell, and Ted and Denise Hotz. They waited for others to show but finally sat and had themselvesa an acceptable dinner.



The second regular meeting in June, set for Tuesday, June 15th was cancelled due to the lack of a quorum.

The non-point/ transect dive was scheduled for Sunday, June 13th. Angelo Correnti reported that there were three boats available for the dive but that Marshall Reynard encountered some mechanical problems and did not feel that it was a very good idea to head out to the Scituate area. So the three skippers, Angelo, Marshall and Tommy Lo loaded up the gear and people and headed out to the area of Hipocrit channel where the divers were able to get a few lobster and a catch of scallops. Angelo stated there were fifteen people on board the boats, ten of them entering the water.

At the first meeting in June, John Blackadar along with Jimmy Walker updated the membership on what has been going on in the search for the elusive 'Babe Ruth's Piano'. Jimmy Walker took much of the data that has been collected on the search for the piano and was able to correct a number of inaccuracies on the charts. He has come up with what could be promising sites that deserve a look. With this new information a group from the club set out to the pond where the piano is supposed to be and did a dive in the respective areas selected as possibilities. They were not successful in finding anything but at least were able to eliminate the locations. A thank you goes out to Jimmy Walker for the time and effort he has put into this project.

The George's Island outing was a no go due to a lack of interest by the membership. Our vice president, Kathi Bell, along with Tom Niu took the ferry out of Boston and had there own picnic on the island and report they had a very nice day and enjoyed visiting George's Island.

There was a night dive scheduled for Tuesday, June, 22nd. At the present time I have no report on this event.

As a result of not having a meeting on Tuesday, June 15th, the vote on the rules change will happen at the regular meeting on Tuesday, July 6th.

Jay Theriault reported on the recent underwater rugby clinic/tournament. There were twenty five players in attendance. They were divided into three teams for the mornig session. Following a lunch of pizza and salad at poolside they broke up into two teams with a full slate of substitutes on each team. This provided for fast play and an opportunity to practice strategy and substitution skills in actual tournament conditions. At the end of the day, Jeanine Fabian hosted a get together at her home.




