UPCOMING EVENTS

As we move into February, the first dive for the month is the non-point dive and it is the ice dive at Long Pond in Plymouth. This dive is a popular event when there is good ice and it appears that the ice should be there this year. The set up crew and anyone wanting to join them will be meeting at 7:00 a.m. at the Bickford's at exit 9 off of Rte. 3 in Kingston for breakfast. To get to Long Pond you take Rte. 3 South and get off the highway at exit 3. At the top of the ramp you go right onto Clark Rd. Follow Clark Rd. to the End. Now you take a quick left and right across the road. You are still on Clark Rd. and it will take you down to Lond Pond.

The point Dive for The month is on Sunday, February 27th, at Pemberton Pier in Hull. Prior to the dive, we will meet for breakfast at 8:00 a.m. at Star's Rest/Diner on Rte. 3A, just North of the Hingham rotary. To Get to Pemberton Pier from the North or from Quincy, you take Rte. 3A over Fore River bridge and follow it to Hull. When you enter Hull you follow the shore out to the end and you will arrive at the pier. From the South, take Rte 3 North until you get to the exit for Rte. 228. Take Rte. 228 and follow it into Hull and then follow the shore out to the end of Hull until you arrive at the pier. If you are coming up the highway from the South and are going to breakfast take a left onto Rte. 3A when Rte.228 intersects it. When you get to the Hingham circle go around the circle and head North on Rte.3A

and go up the road a quarter mile or so and Star's will be in front of you.

At the regular meeting on Tuesday, February 15th, at the completion of the regular order of business we will be showing the film 'Under Quabbin: the search for the lost towns'. The film runs about one hour. Briefly, the Quabbin Reservoir was created in the Swift River Valley in 1939. Four small towns were submerged. Come see how the towns looked a century ago, see how they look today.

On Saturday evening, February 26th, the president, Kathi Bell, has scheduled a night at the Mugar Omni Theater at the Museum of Science in Boston. The time of the show is 8:00 P.M. and the ticket cost is \$6.00. The presentation is "Mystery of the Nile". 


