## SOUTH SHORE NEPTUNES FIFTY YEARS OF DIVING 1955 ----- 2005



**On Saturday evening, February 26th**, there were a total of twenty-two club members and guests at the Museum of Science to watch the showing of the film 'Mystery of the Nile' at the Mugar Theatre. Several members of the group were early and had a bite to eat at the in-house restaurant at the museum and did a little browsing and shopping at the museum store. The film itself was a terrific presentation. The trip down the Nile from its source to the Mediterranean Sea was a fantastic ride once you were used to the twists and turns of the helicopter as it wound its way through and over the terrain. The president's choice of the museum for a night out was a good one.

**The point dive scheduled for Sunday,** February 27th, at Pemberton Pier, Hull, was a no go. After a breakfast at Star's Resturant in Hingham, yours truly went to the dive site and read most of the Sunday paper while awaiting those hearty divers who didn't make it.

There is not much more to report with respect to the scheduled dives for March. The point dive scheduled for Sunday, March 13th, was blown out. After having breakfast at Lincoln Landing Restaurant in Saugus, our president, Kathi Bell, along with Tim Niu, proceeded to Marblehead Light for a look at the sea. Kathi reports that conditions were not good for diving.

**The non-point dive which was scheduled** for Sunday, March 20th, at a site on Cape Ann was also cancelled as a result of the weather. **The weather has not been very** accommodating during the month of March. The first regular membership meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 1st, and the Board meeting set for Tuesday, March 8th, were cancelled. The former due to the lack of a quorum and the latter because of an ice and snow storm.

The 51st Annual Boston Sea Rovers show took place the weekend of March 5th and 6th. The South Shore Neptunes, along with the Bay State Council of Divers and a number of other local dive clubs, were represented at the show. It is reported that this year's presentation did not appear to have had as much vendor support as in past shows. But attendance was up and the Saturday night film fest was a terrific show.

**On the fourth Tuesday of the month,** March 22nd, Ted Hotz brought in a couple of wreck videos on wrecks of The Great Lakes. There were five or six members on hand for the show. Pizza was ordered in.

**On Tuesday evening, March 15th**, immediately following the regular meeting, there was a guest speaker from the Massachusetts Marine Fisheries. Ross Kessler gave a presentation on an eelgrass, *Zostera marina*, restoration project currently underway in Boston Harbor. The necessity for this restoration is due to die-offs in the '30s, pollution and nutrient loading which has left a few small beds in the harbor. With the improved water conditions in the harbor this grass can again grow and provide a habitat for fish, shellfish, and other marine animals, and is particularly important as a refuge for juvenile organisms. It also stabilizes the sediment and buffers wave action. *continued on next page*

The natural revegetation can take decades. Thus, the Mass Marine Fisheries restoration project. Mr. Kessler is looking for volunteers from the dive community to assist in the project. The first date would be harvesting and the second date would be replanting. #### **Upcoming Events**

Here it is the month of April and hopefully Spring has sprung. The non-point dive for the month is scheduled for Sunday, April 10th, at Peggotty Beach, Scituate. Breakfast will be at 8:00 a.m. at the Gannett Grill, Scituate.

The point dive is Sunday, April 24th. This will be a boat run to assist the Mass. Div. of Marine Fisheries in their eelgrass restoration project. The dive will be made to a known eelgrass bed to harvest plants for transplanting in an area where recolonization will likely be successful.

**On Friday evening, April 15th**, Jay Theriault will be leading a dinner night out to the Fours Restaurant, on Cottage Ave, in Quincy center. Using the clubhouse as a landmark, to get to the Fours you go left on Quarry Street. Quarry Street becomes Granite Street. Follow Granite Street into Quincy Center. You will come to a set of lights at the intersection of Granite and Hancock Streets. In front of you to your right is a tall bank building. Cross the intersection and turn right on the far side of the bank. This is Chestnut St. Cottage Ave. is the first right. Go beyond Cottage Ave. and park in the municipal lot which is at the rear of the stores on Cottage Ave.

Sunday, May 1st, will be the non-point dive and it will be the Annual River Run down the North river. For anyone not familiar with the river run, it is a trip down the North river from an entry point I believe is at the birdge at Union St. to Mary's Landing, Rte. 3A, at the Scituate/Marshfield town line. The idea is to use your imagination to create your means of transportation to make a successful trip. We will meet at the parking lot off Rte.3A, in Scituate just before the bridge at Mary's Landing at 8:00 a.m. From there participants will be transported to the entry site. The fiftieth anniversary committee is continung in its work to put together a memorable program to celebrate the South Shore Neptunes fifty year birthday.




