

The underwater Rugby season will be finishing up this month with the ending of the school year and the start of summer vacations. The schedule in the calendar is based on the completion of the school on June 27th. If there is any change you'll find out at one of the sessions. There was a special election held at the general meeting on Tuesday, May 17th. There were two vacancies filled on the Board of Directors. Elected to fill these openings for the remainder of the term were Bill Burchill and Ken Hayes. Also elected at this meeting were two alternates to the board in the event any other vacancies arise. The two alternates elected are Joe Geyer and Terri Molis.

At the conclusion of the May 17th, general meeting, Paul Adler, life member, gave a video and narrative presentation on a dive trip made to the Galapagos Islands. The report is, it was a terrific video. There was diving with sharks and sea turtles. There are no hotels for your stay so its travel on a live aboard. And this trip is available currently at \$5000.00.

The president had made arrangements to have a CPR class here at the clubhouse on Wednesday, May 18th, but had to cancel because there was a minimum number of participants required to attend and the minimum was not met. The minimum necessary for the instructor to run the class is ten. There were only five who wanted to get certified.

The Annual Bay State Council Treasure Hunt which was scheduled for Sunday, May 22nd, was cancelled due to bad weather and lack of participants. The Hunt will be rescheduled and it appears at this time it will take place in September.

On Saturday, May 28th, the Braintree Underwater Search and Recovery Unit, formerly the Quincy Underwater Search and Recovery Unit was back in action in Avon/Brockton. There is an organization in MA., 'The Licensed Private Detectives Association of Massachusetts', that contacted John Blackadar and asked John if the dive team was interested in being a part of the organization. The association is looking at old cases that have hit dead ends. The particular case the team was used for was a missing female from the Brockton area. The case is ten or more years old. The recovery unit along with a team using cadaver sniffing dogs were asked to search a

pond and also a culvert in Avon/Brockton. There were several members of the dive team on hand and the unit was able to cover several areas of interest. There were three teams of five divers/snorkelers entering the water and they were supported by other team personnel on the surface. As a result of Saturday's search, John Blackadar stated that the team may be returning to take another closer look at one of the sites. John thanks those members of the team who turned out to support the unit on a holiday weekend. John Blackadar also wants to remind any one interested that they are welcome to become a part of the 'Search & Recovery Unit.' And if you know anyone interested in joining, have them contact John and let him know of their interest.

The South Shore Neptunes had planned to run an introduction to SCUBA demonstration at the Lincoln Hancock School prior to school closing for the Summer. But at this time the program has been put on hold until the Fall. It appears that there are too many things scheduled at the pool at this time. And there are only so many hours of pool time available.

**Bill Bartin was at the Board** meeting and gave a preliminary report on the club audit. Everything appears to be in order and he will have the final audit at the next board meeting.

**Bill Burchill reported that** he took in a presentation by a local historian on the Sinking of the steamer Portland, a side-wheeler passenger boat, that sunk in a gale off the Massachusetts coast. Bill states that he is going to see if he can line up this party to speak at one of our meetings.

## **Upcoming Events**

The first event up for June is the non-point dive set for Sunday, June 5th. The dive is scheduled as a boat dive and the site for the dive will be determined at the dock before the boats depart. Remember, departure time is 8:00 a. m. from the floats at the Quincy Yacht Club. Boats will make pass by Pemberton Pier on way to meet others at dive site at 9:00 a.m.

On Sunday, June 12th, there is a point dive and it will be at Shag Rocks, outside Boston Light. With the weather the way it's been, it's hard to tell what to expect. But there have been many lobsters taken in this area in past years. The boats will leave from the Quincy docks at 8:00 a. m., make a pass by Pemberton and meet at the dive site at 9:00 a.m. And remember to take care of the skipper's lunch.
