**Dickie Gullicksen** recently shared great photographs of his boat, Heidi, with some members of the *Club*. The *Secretary* asked Dickie for the "story" behind the pictures:

"I was hit by a 38' Tiara Yacht on July 22nd near Herring Cove off P-town. He hit me near the stern on the port side, went right up and over the outboard motor and pushed it under water. When it came up, it was half full of water. I didn't know how much damage was done, so I beached it. The estimate was over \$10,000. Luckily, nobody was hurt. I had my son-in-law and his cousin with me. It was 11am and I was trolling at about 3knots. I saw him coming & said, 'this guy doesn't see me. We are out of here'. So, I turned the wheel and put that big 200hp to work. I thought I made it, but all of a sudden I felt the hit. He has two 480hp V8's in his boat, and was going faster than I thought. He said, he 'didn't see me'. I said, 'I can tell'". He said he, 'thought he hit a rock'. Heidi is strong like bull. If I didn't move, he would have totaled her, and who knows how much bodily damage he would have done."

"Heidi is all back together. Looks good and runs good. You can't tell she was hit at all". In August, Dickie took two of our *Members*, **Bill Schwabe**, Oak Bluffs and **Dave Clancy**, Florida to the breakwater in Provincetown. It was a nice dive with excellent visibility, water temperature was approximately 72°, and one lobster was taken by Bill.

Dickie, we're ALL relieved to hear that due to your quick thinking and response, <u>you</u>, <u>your passengers</u> and the "Indestructible" <u>Heidi</u> survived and prevailed!


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
