As reported on the NECWA Website (www.necwa.org), "The England Coastal Wildlife Alliance -NECWA is an environmental organization based in southeastern Massachusetts that conducts research on coastal marine wildlife and participates in educational outreach in the New England community. Projects like NEBShark and the Marine Wildlife Research Project allow NECWA staff to study the unique marine wildlife that live and feed off coastal New England. NECWA shares the results of these studies with local organizations and with interested members of the public. By combining research with educational outreach, NECWA can more effectively increase public awareness to the issues that threaten our coastal marine habitats and the species that live there."

SWEEP flyer, "COAST SWEEP is part of the International Coastal Cleanup organized by The Ocean Conservancy in Washington, DC. Participants all over the world collect marine debris and record the types of trash they collect. This information is then used to help reduce future marine debris problems.

Dive safety is paramount. A key to being fully prepared is to have a Dive Emergency Plan. A Dive Emergency Action Plan (EAP). An EAP is site specific and consist of emergency numbers for DAN, EMS, emergency numbers, medical facility locations and contact numbers, and location of O2 and other first aid equipment.

BASKING SHARK TALK

Krill Carson of the New England Coastal Wildlife Alliance will be giving a talk on the Basking Shark and Ocean Sunfish at the South Shore Natural Science Center on February 17, 2010. The talk is part of the "Water Watch" series at the Science Center. According to the The Science Center "The basking shark, Cetorhinus maximus, is one of the largest fish in the world, second only in size to the whale shark. Although giants in size reaching lengths of 38 feet and weighing up to 8,500 pounds basking sharks feed zooplankton. which are organisms that drift in the ocean. Join Carol "Krill" Carson as she regales us with stories of these gentle giants and how citizen scientists are being trained to provide sighting information on basking sharks and ocean sunfish observed from a beach or from a vessel offshore."

The NECWA looks for volunteers to sight these mag-nificent animals. South Shore Neptunes is seeking ways to assist in this effort, either by seeking opportunities to sight these sharks while diving or to participate in a sighting expedition on the Captain John boats out of Plymouth, MA. The officers of the club are working to schedule a date for Krill to speak to the club or possibly at the Bay State Council There will be more meeting. information to follow as the talk is scheduled.
