#### MAY 17th: Philippines slide show

On Tuesday May 17th Ralph Fuller will talk about diving in the Philippines. Come see photos of ornate pipefish, multitudinous frogfishes and his being buzzed by a banded coral snake.

Ralph has worked as a newspaper reporter and as a public relations officer and marketing director for a university, medical school and teaching hospital. He was Director of Public Affairs for 21 years at Lahey Clinic. Since retiring in 2001 Ralph has been freelancing, mostly writing medical and science articles for several hospitals and a national academic association.

Ralph has been diving since 1993 and has recently passed the milestone of his 600<sup>th</sup> logged dive. He has dived throughout the Caribbean, including visiting Bonaire 10+ times, both coasts of Australia, the Galapagos Islands and the Philippines.

Combining his penchant for underwater photography, science writing and a passion for the marine life he sees, he has just established a website – The Neptune Blog (<u>www.theneptuneblog.com</u>) – about life in the ocean.

#### JUNE 21st: Underwater Metal Detecting

Moe DiPinto is an accomplished treasure hunter and fellow diver. He is currently a product specialist at Metaldetector.com in Southborough, MA. He has over twenty years of treasure hunting experience and has been diving for over a decade. Anyone who knows Moe will tell you that he gets great excitement from locating old coins and jewelry. He spends the majority of his time diving in fresh water. He is always on the lookout for new spots to pursue his hobby. He finds old beach sites and swimming holes to be the most productive sites to hunt. He will be the first to tell you that the rewards that can come from these sites are remarkable. Treasure hunting with a Metal Detector adds a new dimension and excitement to his dives. At the meeting, Moe will bring several top under water detectors to demonstrate. #### ARTIFACT OF THE YEAR CONTEST OFFICIAL RULES AND REGISTRATION FORM

- 1. Each participant must be a current member of the South Shore Neptunes Skin Diver's Club, Inc. upon submitting each entry into the Artifact of the Year Contest.
- 2. Each artifact submitted into this contest must be recovered from New England waters.
- 3. Each year this contest will begin on January 1 and end on November 30.
- 4. Each entry must be accompanied by an official registration form.
- 5. Any and all current SSN club members may enter this contest as often as he/she wishes provided all rules and requirements are met.
- 6. Artifact must be recovered using SCUBA.
- 7. If possible, the artifact should be brought to a club meeting before and after restoration. This is not a prerequisite to winning the award, however it will help promote wreck diving interest.
- 8. Artifact will be judged on the basis of the following criteria:
  - a. Uniqueness of the artifact.
  - b. Historical value of the shipwreck
  - c. Condition of the artifact before restoration
  - d. Difficulty of recovery
  - e. Restoration plans

#### ANNUAL UNDERWATER PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST OFFICIAL RULES

- 1. Each participant must be a current member of the South Shore Neptunes Skin Divers' Club, Inc. upon submitting each entry into the Annual Underwater Photography Contest.
- 2. Each photograph submitted into this contest must be taken in New England waters.
- 3. Each year this contest will begin on January 1 and end on November 30.
- 4. Each entry must be a print measuring five inches by seven inches.
- 5. Each entry must be accompanied by an official registration form.
- 6. Any and all current SSN club member may enter this contest as often as he/she wishes providing all rules and requirements are met.
- 7. Each contestant is responsible for acquiring his/her own photographic equipment and must pay for his/her own film and film processing.
- 8. Should any diver(s) or person(s) be included as subjects in the entry to be considered, their names(s) must be supplied where designated on the registration form.
- 9. The contestant will indemnify and hold the South Shore Neptunes Skin Divers' Club, Inc. and all of its assigns harmless for and against all claims arising from the use of any and all entries submitted.
- 10. The print judged as the winning print will become the property of the South Shore Neptunes Skin Divers' Club, Inc. and will not be returned.
- 11. Non-winning photographs shall be returned upon written request, otherwise, they will be stored in a designated club photo album with their photographic specifications as written on the accompanying registration form.

# LARGEST LOBSTER CONTEST:

- 1. Members must show their lobster licenses before being able to register in the lobster contest.
- 2. The largest lobster contest will run from December 1 to November 30. In order to be eligible for the lobster contest an entrant must show a Massachusetts lobster license. Weights must be witnessed by a valid signed slip from a fish market or bait shop. Members must register their catches at a club meeting within 30 days after the catch takes place. A trophy for the largest lobster of the year will be awarded.

# SALEM STATE UNIVERSITY DIVE COURSE

Underwater Research Methods Course (BIO 344, 4 Credits) at Salem State University Course Location: Cat Cove Marine Lab (M & W: 9 – 4; May 23 – June 29, 2011)

**Course Description:** This course is designed to introduce scuba certified students to research methods used in the study of biology, ecology and physiology of sub tidal organisms. Current underwater research methods are taught and implemented in underwater exercises. Potential topics for lectures and labs include: diving physics, physiology, dive planning, first aid for diving professionals, sampling design, statistical analysis, underwater photography, population census methods and fish habitat surveys. This course fulfills the American Academy of Underwater Sciences (AAUS) scientific diver training requirements. Three lecture hours and one four-hour lab per week (12 Dives).

**Prerequisites:** Basic Open Water Scuba certification, an Introductory Biology laboratory sequence; or permission of Department Chairperson. Students must supply their own scuba equipment.
