WHO'S BEEN DIVING??? August 2011

Lady of the Lakes July 9th.

On Saturday, July 9th a group of Neptunes, accompanied by some dive buddies from the Dive Society group out of Diver's Market in Plymouth, made the trek to Lake Winnipesaukee to dive on the *Lady of the Lake*. Neptunes present were John Pell, Rich Bowers, Mark Driscoll, Doug Meyers, Matt Meyers, Doug Eaton, Vik Benson, and Steve Marshall. From Plymouth, the Neptunes were joined by Theresa Gormley, Jack Ahern, Peter Renaud, and Stan Snowman.

It was a beautiful, sunny day on the lake. We all met at the dive operation at around 8 am. Once all the paperwork and payment was done we loaded up the dive boat and headed out across the lake. The lake is quite large and after a 45 minute boat ride we made it to the dive site.

Some divers wore dry suits and others wet and after suiting up we entered the water. The weather the day before was rainy and it was windy on the day of the dive. Consequently, the visibility was not very good.

We descended down the anchor line on to the wreck. Exploration commenced! The water was about 64 degrees and you not hit the thermo cline until descending below deck. Some divers circled to explore the outside, including the infamous fantail of the *Lady*. Others penetrated to look below deck. All that remains of *The Lady* is from the main deck down but this is remarkably well preserved after 116 years. Fresh water is a great preservative for wooden wrecks.

The Lady rests in about 35 feet of water and so the dive lasted approximately an hour. Once everyone returned safely, the operation moved to the second dive site, *The Pile Driver Barge*. This is exactly what it sounds like. It is a wooden steam barge and the boiler and crane are still attached. This barge went down around 1910 and rests in about 50 feet of water not far from Wiers Beach.

There is nice "warm" water to just above the deck, at about 45 feet, but once we descended on to the deck we hit the thermo cline. WOW that was cold! The water temperature dropped from a balmy 64 degrees to a quite chilly 48 to 52 degrees.

This wreck is also in reasonably good shape after one hundred years on the bottom. We explored for anywhere from thirty to fifty minutes depending on tolerance to the cold. The visibility was quite poor but we're used to that.

Once we explored the wreck we all ascended above the thermo cline to warm up in the balmy waters of Lake Winnipesaukee. Returning to the boat, we all prepared for the journey back to port.

It was quite windy on the lake and it was about any hour's ride back. We all and a chance to tell our tale about our individual dive. This was a great day with good diving, even with limited visibility. Many of us would like to make this trip again. If you are interested, let Steve Marshall know and he will look to arrange another fun fill trip.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Victoria Stevens: Hull Lifesaving Museum September 20th

The Hull Lifesaving Museum is located in the historic 1889 Point Allerton US Lifesaving Station, home of Captain Joshua James and his crew of legendary surfmen. Victoria Stevens is the museum's curator, a position that includes everything from collections care and exhibits planning to searching tidal pools for sea stars with intrepid preschool explorers. Before coming to the Lifesaving Museum in 2001, Victoria studied Art History at Harvard University and Museum Studies at Tufts University. Working in the field of maritime history allows Victoria to combine many of her passions - teaching, museums, history, and the coast. In 2010, with support from the Massachusetts Foundation for the Humanities, Victoria worked with Audissey Guides to launch a new website, bostonshipwrecks.org, a resource for researching Boston Harbor's historic shipwrecks.

Victoria will be bringing two versions of the shipwreck chart: a Boston Harbor Shipwreck chart that goes for \$15.00, and a Hull/Cohasset Shipwrecks version that goes for \$6.
