The first weekend in June saw some interesting diving. Mike, Peter and Ken went out to Beavertail. There was a bit of surge, 5 feet of visibility and one big tautog.

Jeannine, Mike, Chuck went out with Boston Scuba for a charter dive over Memorial Day and all came back with pounds and pounds of scallops. 60-70 ft of depth, water of 49 degrees and so many scallops that Jeannine could not close her catch bag of the first dive.

June 10 Mike dove with Yuriy at Pebble Beach. One lobster. 53 degrees. Mike also dove with John Schultz on the 15th. They did not have good visibility.

Doug, Mike, Peter dove at Old Garden. Mike got 8 lobsters and the vis was great at 20ft.

Dave went on a shark cage dive on Saturday June 28. Ken, Teri and Erica did their shark trip on Sunday June 29. Teri and Erica did not dive, rather they snorkeled in Charlie's play pen. On Sunday, they saw 7 blue sharks and were able to tag 5 of them. There was a group from CT with a drone that captured lots of footage. On Saturday they saw not only sharks, but also a Minke Whale! Charlie's boat is only \$189 for the day, out at 8 am and back by 4pm. Ken's looking to do another trip in the early fall.
