# Who's been diving?

Peter, Mike and Erica went looking for tropical fish. Mike & Erica saw some though they did not capture them. Peter went off on his own to hunt for edible fish though he did not come back with any dinner. MaryEllen also joined to tropical fish hunters and found that the water was a pleasant 67 degrees.

Jeannine went to Jamaica and was able to get two dives in a day, diving on nitrox (for the same price as air!). Lots of life on the coral and the water was a pleasant 85 degrees at 90+ feet and 86 degrees at 30'. In fact, a the surface, she found the water a little too warm and when snorkeling, enjoyed the cooler temperatures at 10'. Several lion fish were spotted on each dive and the locals there do remove them when they get a chance (they make tasty eating). One dive master was telling us that there were two times in his life when he cried; once when his mother died, and the other was when he get pricked by a lionfish. He said the pain was so intense. None of us bothered with the lion fish though there were some rather large ones that would have made for some delicious dining. Doug and Matt Meyers went to Dutch Springs. Though it was a rainy day they said that there was over 100 divers lined up by 8am ready to dive. The second day at the Springs was sunny and beautiful. They scootered past helicopters and wrecks.
