Providing moral and logistical support were Theresa Czerepica, Paul Green, Tommy Lo, Ken and Teri Hayes.

Notice I said "dove or tried to dive. I lost one of my fins trying to put it on in the murky bay water of Pleasure bay. My dive buddy, Mike Vaughan, tried in vain to help me locate it. It was an unfortunate way to begin the New Year's dive season. Oh well! Fortunately, there is always next week.



Thirty-nine minutes after entering the water, the first dive team of Peter Ninh and Bonnie Zeller returned skunked and cold. Others drifted in over the next hour or so. Doug bottomed out at 40', recording the deepest dive I am aware of, and Mike Vaughan lasted nearly an hour and brought back 2 bugs. I counted a lobster haul of around 6 among all the divers, none bringing back more than two. Tim Burke (Above) may have brought in the largest of all the lobsters caught. It was a beautiful sunny Sunday morning with air temps in the mid 40s, H20 at 37-38°, depending on depth, and LOW vis! A great way and day to begin the New Year's dive season.

I almost forgot: As we were finishing up and getting ready to head out to Jay Theriault's for his annual post-dive News Year's Day feast and football afternoon (THANKS, JAY!), a couple of groups of young people decided to emulate the L Street Brownies's New Year's Day plunge into the harbor.
