May 6 - May 13 - Bonaire Trip

It's hard to imagine getting a large group on one plane with only a minimal amount of headaches, now take it up a notch and have 36 people on that flight and a suggested arrival time to the airport of 4:00-4:30 am. For the most part, it was two uneventful flights from Boston \rightarrow Newark \rightarrow Bonaire arriving around 2 pm to the resort.

When we arrived at the resort, we had fruit punch with (or without) prosecco, sat through the resort briefing and filled out some paperwork, finally got the room keys. The rooms were nice, but I'd have to say the air conditioning could use a significant improvement. I do like to complain from time-to-time. At least the AC cooled the room a couple degrees and took some of the humidity out.

The resort did not have lots of fancy features, but it did serve the purposes we were there for. Good food, drink and easy access diving (and for those that rented trucks, easy access shore diving). Toucan Diving Bonaire took care of us and led our large group to various sites around Bonaire including the islet, Klein Bonaire. The dive leaders and dive masters showed us sea turtles, spotted eagle rays, moray eels and even hunted lionfish to share with us at the conclusion of the trip. Here's the list of dive sites off the boat:

Capt. Don's Reef, Sharon's Serenity, Angel City, Lighthouse Point, 1000 Steps, Andrea 2, Rock Pile, Knife, South Bay, Munk's Haven, Red Slave, Salt Pier

A few of us also went on shore dives to sites including Tolo (Ol' Blue), Oil Slick Leap, Weber's Joy, Invisibles, Aquarius, White Slave, Something Special and Alice in Wonderland. Shore diving was incredible with the reef within feet or with a short surface swim over the sand regardless if on the northwest or southwest shores. We did not dive the East side, which had very large waves observed from the beach.



We also had another "rock" painted with the club graphics. This time, a concrete trip hazard in the bar area of Toucan Diving. We also found the original rock that was painted in previous years.

The return flight had a bit of a hiccup in Newark due to weather and plane issues, I heard some of the group got in around 3 am.

Overall, I was able to get 18 dives in between the boat, a bunch of shore diving with Todd Alger and a night dive with Doug Eaton and Matt Meyer. We had a really good trip and want to thank our meal host, Quincy; captain of the boat for Toucan Diving, Jeroen; and Matthew, Brandon, Luiyi, Rugene (AKA Spider) who were our dive masters leading us about. I also want to send thanks to anyone else I may have missed.

The club will most likely host a movie/picture night for everyone that wants to share what they took on the trip and to answer any questions or share more stories.
