Club Dives Do's and Don'ts

The club schedules at least two club dives per month with the focus to get as many divers into the water at the same location. This is more than two fold, it allows new members a chance to get out with experienced divers, it also increases the camaraderie and allows people to make more dive buddies to go with on the non-club dive days. We schedule these in advance to allow our members the opportunity to schedule their dives around them in the hopes to achieve the objectives previously mentioned. It is important to participate in the club dives and events to provide new members a welcoming environment and to keep the vitality of the club.

Due to the diversity of our club members, it is not always possible to make the club dive or the dive of your choice. It could be because you may partake in a boat dive with a friend while the club is doing a shore dive. Or, if you're really into finding bottles, taking pictures or diving a wreck while the club is going out to lobster or scallop dive. We know it happens and it is OK to miss the club dive, things come up that cause plans to change or in some cases plans to stay fixed.

With that being said, we do have to remind folks of the way the club operates on Club Dive days. We have had some issues in the past where the location was changed and not communicated, others getting confused as to whether an individual's post about a dive location is the actual club dive location.

Here's a few rules to ensure communication is solid and nobody is left wondering why the club didn't show up somewhere.

- 1. Club Dives always begin from the former clubhouse on the corner of Joyce Rd and Quarry St in Quincy (unless previously announced at a meeting and published in the newsletter) at either 8 am or 9 am depending on the time of the year. See the club calendar on the website for exact times.
- 2. If for whatever reason, you cannot make it to the club house meeting point or you're running late. Call or text the club hotline 617-804-5637 to find out where the club will dive or if they will wait for you.
- 3. If you will not go to the club dive, please do not share invitations or requests for a dive buddy through the club channels (Facebook, GroupMe or other group texts). Effectively, keep your activity (dive or otherwise) "private" on club dive days. All other days, utilize all the channels to find dive buddies.

Please consider these guidelines when you're diving on a club-dive day. Sometimes we forget and make honest mistakes. Let's have more fun together doing what we love!

Dive Reports Club Dive - Sunday, November 26 - Gun Rock

Several Neptunes met at the old club house including: President-Adrienne Murphy, Alex Wieck, Calvin Stephenson, Rick Hovey and myself. We decided to head South to dive Gun Rock Beach. Upon entering the water, we broke up into groups and headed out to the right and around the point to explore the jetty and adjacent beach area. We explored many pass-throughs and shallow ravines looking for lobsters and finding an abundance of sea life. Water temp was around 43 with 15-20 feet of visibility. Total dive time was between 60 and 70 minutes. Alex came back with a nice catch of lobsters. We were greeted by VP-Ken Hayes and Paul Greene on our departure from the water. We followed the dive with food and drinks at The Snug Pub in Hingham

November 11 - Canoe Beach, Nahant

Sokol Prifti, Alex Weick, Paul Greene and I met up at the former club house to go diving. We called the Nahant Police department in advance and confirmed we could dive at Canoe Beach. Alex truck-pooled us up and we suited up. Three of us dove wet, while the other dry. We also ran into Maura Keane and Ferdinand Vesely from iDive New England (<u>https://www.idivenewengland.com/</u>) who were there before us preparing to dive (both dry).



Unfortunately, Alex isn't in the picture above as he was already underway to search for lobsters. Paul and I buddied up and headed out. We swam past the rock pile/chimney area where we saw Sokol and Alex's flags and dropped down heading directly away from the beach. Wwe did not see much other than some boulders spread across the sand due to swimming perpendicular to the beach entry. I'd have to guess we were about the same distance from the chimney to the shore when we surfaced at half-tank, i.e. a pretty long swim back. On the way back in in, I ran into Alex's flag and found him still hunting. We all pretty much ended the first dive at the same time. At this point, Paul and I were both cold and called it a day. Sokol and Alex went in for another dive, with Sokol having the most bottom time...and he did two dives diving wet! Alex, was a bit dryer on the second dive after switching out his wrist seal that had a hole in it to dry gloves. All-in-all we had a good dive and both Sokol and Alex had some success lobstering.
