Notes of Interest

FEDERAL DONKEY OF THE MONTH

The federal government is moving with it's usual infinite wisdom to get rid of flies with heavy artillery and rockets. BAY STATE COUNCIL

The BSC has done it again. As most of you may know, the Mass. Dept. of Fisheries was contemplating a daily "bag limit" for non-commercial divers. The BSC apllied all of the muscle it had for leverage to defeat this notion, and they were successful. This was quite a task since the state didn't need legislative approval for this limit. However the BSC has quite a reputation now through the various efforts of the officers and the lobbyist, and they are a force to be pounted. The BSC does not run on good wishes and intentions, they MEKKE need bucks. The South Shore Neptunes have always supported the BSC in the past and will do so now, but you must take the initiative. The BSC dues are 5 dollars, contact Joel Gray and the Neptunes will NMM pay 2 of the 5 dollar dues, that only leaves 3 for you to pay. So far this year only 30 or so members have paid BSC dues, so let's take a more active role - get the money up. October Happenings




